WIC- A parent can call their local WIC clinic directly or the administrative office (210) 207.4650 to schedule an appointment. Parents can provide needed documents via email. During this time the State has allowed the waiving of child's height, weight, etc. so child is not required to attend appointment. They are trying to avoid parent having to enter the clinic for any reason, unless of course parent is on bus or walking, then they will bring into clinic. Parks and Recreations- Park Community Centers are distribution sites, SA Food Bank is managing the distribution and schedule. Their distribution schedule on their website is updated daily.		Operating 18 drive-up distribution sites at Parks and Recreation community centers. Children to-go meals are available for pick-up during lunch and dinner, 11:30 am - 1 pm (lunch distribution) and 4:30 pm - 6pm (dinner distribution). One free meal will be provided for each child in the vehicle. Family packed meals will be available at a designated community center one day per week, 4:30 pm - 6:30 pm. Family packs include a weekly supply of food for a family of four. The San Antonio Food Bank is providing enough food to serve between 150-200 families per site per week. In an effort to practice social distancing, staff are loading meals into vehicle trunks.
